LISBON (AP) — Jose Baptista Pinheiro de Azevedo, a navy career man who rose through the ranks to become military prime minister and oversee Portugal's first democratic elections in 48 years, died yesterday of a heart attack. He was 66.

In 1974, Pinheiro de Azevedo was appointed prime minister by the military to moderate the country's shift to the left under prime minister Col. Vasco Goncalves. Pinheiro de Azevedo also supervised the 1976 balloting that was Portugal's first democratic election in 48 years.
