### Funeral Friday For Rehoboth Shooting Victim

REHOBOTH — A funeral service will be held Friday at 10 a.m. in St. Dominic's Church, Swansea, for Mrs. Mary D. (Dias) Cordeiro, 67, of 101 Mason St. She died Monday of a gunshot wound in the front yard of her home.

She was pronounced dead at the scene by Dr. James N. Shamey, a Bristol County medical examiner, shortly after 4 p.m. Her husband, Manuel, 72, of 146 Willard Ave., Swansea, was to be charged with the murder.

Until retiring in 1972, Mrs. Cordeiro was employed as a spooler for ITT Wire and Cable Co., of Pawtucket, R.I. She belonged to the Senior Citizens of Rehoboth and Swansea, and was a communicant of St. Dominic's Church, Swansea.

Born in Seekonk, daughter of the late Diogo M. and Amelia (DeSilva) Dias, she had resided in Rehoboth for the past 60 years.

She leaves a daughter, Mrs. Marie P. Kelly of Silver Spring, Fla.; two sons by a previous marriage, Joseph M. Travers Jr., of Seekonk, and Gilbert M. Travers of Rehoboth; two sisters, Mrs. Helen Souza of Rehoboth, and Mrs. Amelia D. Tavares of Pawtucket, R.I.; two brothers, Frank Dias of Seekonk and Joseph Dias of Bristol, R.I.; and 14 grandchildren.

Burial will be in Mount St. Mary's Cemetery, Pawtucket, R.I.
