

William P. Ledoux; victim of car crash

WESTPORT, Mass. — William P. Ledoux, 18, of 198 Tecumseh St., Fall River, was fatally injured early yesterday when his car left Route 6, struck a utility pole and split in two.

Police said Mr. Ledoux was alone when the car went off the highway near State Road about 3:15 a.m. He was pronounced dead at St. Anne's Hospital, Fall River, a half hour later.

Mr. Ledoux worked at Dave's Tire Co., Fall River.

He was born in Fall River, a son of Charles and Verna (Medeiros) Ledoux.

Besides his parents he leaves three brothers, Jeffrey Ledoux, stationed at Mt. Home Air Force Base, Idaho, and Edward and Charles Ledoux Jr., and two sisters, Debra and Cheryl Ledoux, all of Fall River.

The funeral will be held Tuesday at 8 a.m. from the August Hebert & Son Funeral Home, 945 S. Main St., with a Mass of Christian Burial at 9 at St. Joseph's Church, North Main Street. Burial will be in Notre Dame Cemetery.
