

Crash kills daughter of trash contractor

FALL RIVER — A funeral mass will be said tomorrow at 10 a.m. at Holy Name Church, Hanover Street, for Karen A. Jarabek, 17, a senior at B.M.C. Durfee High School, who died Sunday at Charlton Memorial Hospital of injuries suffered in an automobile accident.

She was the daughter of Allen L. and Barbara N. (Santos) Jarabek of 119½ Highland Ave. Her father, a member of the Fall River school committee, is the owner of Jarabek Disposal Company, which holds Taunton's trash collection contract.

Miss Jarabek and three friends were returning from a Saturday night dance in Newport in the Jarabek station wagon when the driver, Carlin Hart, 18, of 1569 Robeson St., lost control of the vehicle, which struck a tree on North Eastern Avenue.

They had returned early because Hart was scheduled to work the midnight shift at a skating rink, police said.

Hart is a patient at Charlton Memorial Hospital. Two other passengers, Karen McDonald, 17, of 208 Lincoln Ave., and Jeffrey McGuinness, 18, of 972 Maple St., are patients at Rhode Island Hospital.

Born in Fall River, Miss Jarabek was employed during the summers as a lifeguard at Evangeline T. Healey swimming pool in Kennedy Park.

At the high school, she was head cheerleader, and a member of the National Honor Society and student government. She was a member of Durfee's champion swimming team and captain of the girls' diving team.

She also worked as a recreation instructor at the high school swimming pool, and was a communicant of Holy Name Church.

In addition to her parents, she leaves a brother, Allen L. Jarabek Jr., a sophomore at Durfee, and two sisters, Jody L. Jarabek, a student at The Newport College, Salve Regina, and Cindy L. Jarabek, a student at Boston University.

She is also survived by her maternal grandmother, Mrs. Rose Delaney, of Swansea, and her paternal grand-

mother, Mrs. Helen Sylvester, of Fall River, along with several aunts, uncles and cousins.
