

MANUEL ROGERS

AUBURN, N.Y. — Manuel Rogers, 68, of 43 Grant Ave., and formerly of Taunton, died unexpectedly yesterday at Auburn Memorial Hospital. He was the husband of Doris James Rogers.

Born in Taunton, he was employed for 40 years in the plastics industry. He attended Massachusetts Institute of Technology, New Bedford Technical School, Fall River Technical School, Rhode Island Technical School and the Hamilton Business School.

He was employed for 15 years as general foreman of General Electric in Taunton. He was manager of moulding, tool and engineering at Modern Plastics; manager of Moulding Corporation of America, Pawtucket, R.I.; part owner of Plastic Embedments of Attleboro; and was assistant manager of moulding at the Booten Company, Booton, N.J.

For the last 15 years he was production manager of special production at General Products, Union Springs, N.Y., until his retirement in 1979.

Rogers served as past president of the Syracuse New York Chapter of S.P.E. from 1970-1971; program chairman of the New Hampshire Chapter of S.M.E.; and a member of S.P.I. for 10 years.

He was a communicant of St. Alphonsus Church in Auburn, a supporter of the Boy Scouts for 22 years, and a past president of the Attleboro, Mass., Parent Teacher Association council.

Surviving are his wife; five daughters, Mrs. David (Peggy) Beck, of Akron, Ohio, Mrs. Jack (Sandi) Dalziel and Mrs. Stephen (Martha) Berry, both of Auburn, Mrs. Dorothy Berson of the Hawaiian Islands, and Miss Barbara Rogers of Attleboro.
