

# Dighton youth dies as result of car crash

NEW BEDFORD — Kenneth Alan Rose, 19, of 505 Center St., Dighton, a Southeastern Massachusetts University sophomore and a sports correspondent for the Taunton Daily Gazette, was killed yesterday morning when his car slid off a snow-covered road in Dartmouth and struck a utility pole.

Rose was transported to St. Luke's Hospital and died at 7:30 last night.

Dartmouth police said that Rose's car, a Honda Civic, was traveling on Cross Road in Dartmouth. He was on his way to work as a library intern at SMU at the time.

A chemistry major at SMU, Rose was a 1982

graduate of Dighton-Rehoboth Regional High School, where he was inducted as a member of the National Honor Society. He was also a member of the school's concert and marching bands, and a member of the chess team.

Born in Taunton, he was the son of Edward H. and Anna Mae (Perry) Rose of Dighton.

Besides his parents, he is survived by a brother, Lawrence E. Rose of Whitman; a maternal grandmother, Mary A. Perry of Dighton, and paternal grandparents Frank and Julia (Furmanik) Rose of Berkley.
