Joseph Victorino, 60, of 45 Arlington St., died suddenly Tuesday at the New England Deaconess Hospital in Boston after a brief illness. He was the husband of Mary C. (Lima) Victorino.

Born in Taunton, son of the late Manuel S. and Angela (Silva) Victorino, he was educated in local schools and was a lifelong resident of this city.

He was a communicant of St. Anthony's Church and a member of the Portuguese American Civic Club.

He was formerly employed for 14 years at the Taunton Municipal Lighting Plant as an engineer, retiring in 1977. He was a member of the AFL-CIO, Local 462.

During World War Two, he served with the U. S. Army in Headquarters Company 526th Armored Infantry Battalion which was involved in the battles of Northern France, the Rhineland and Central Europe. He was awarded the European-African-Middle Eastern Theater Campaign Ribbon, American Theater Campaign Ribbon, Victory Medal and the Good Conduct Ribbon.
